What is **ORCID**?

ORCID = Open Researcher and Contributor IDentifier



What is **ORCID**?

- A 16 digit, persistent, unique identifier, helps with name disambiguation
- A non-profit organization
 - An international-scale open research effort
- An interoperable tool
- Registry of open research data
- A set of standard procedures for connecting researchers to their affiliations and activities

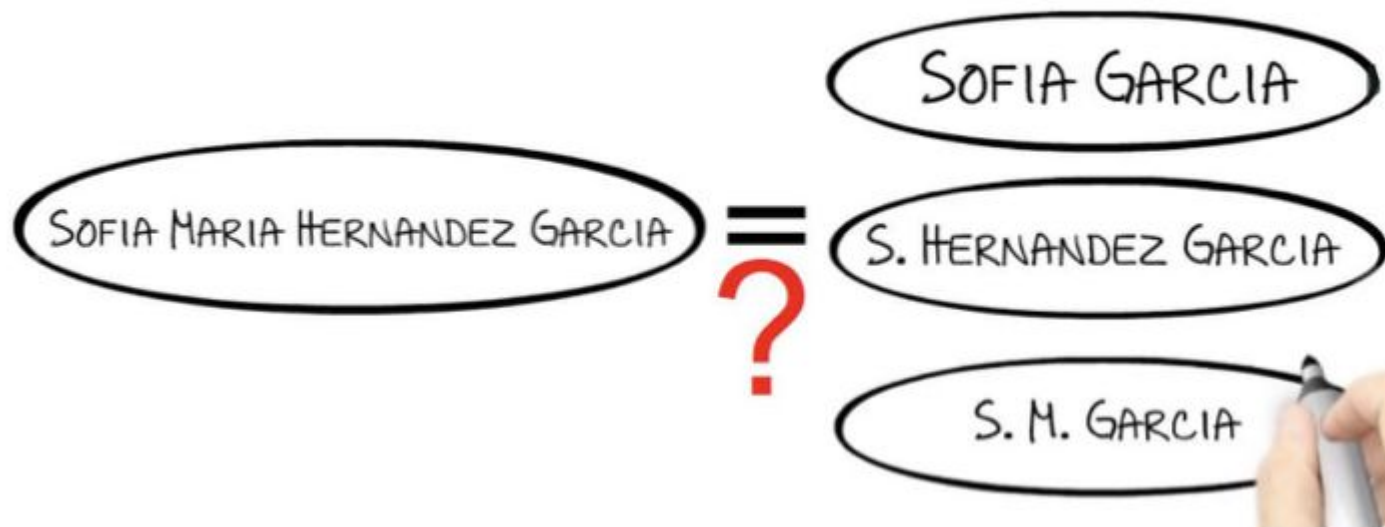

Biography

I seek to answer fundamental questions about the interactions between human-induced global change and energy and materials transformations at the sediment-water interface. The chemical, physical, and biological processes hosted in aquatic soils and sediments are central to the global elemental cycles that make our planet habitable. I use a combination of extremely high-resolution chemical sensors, stable isotope- and radioisotope-based biogeochemical process rate measurements, flux measurements, diagenetic modeling, and long-term, in situ environmental monitoring in my research.

Linking an existing **ORCID** account to Rowan University

The first time you sign in using your institutional or social media account from ORCID, you will be asked to connect your ORCID account by signing in using your ORCID username (email address or ORCID iD) and password, and then confirm that the accounts be linked. After that, you may sign in using your ORCID credentials or any linked account.

Link your United ID account to your ORCID record

How to add content to your **ORCID** account

Publications

ORCID automatically connects to several external databases to easily import your previous works to your profile:

We recommend using Crossref or Scopus.

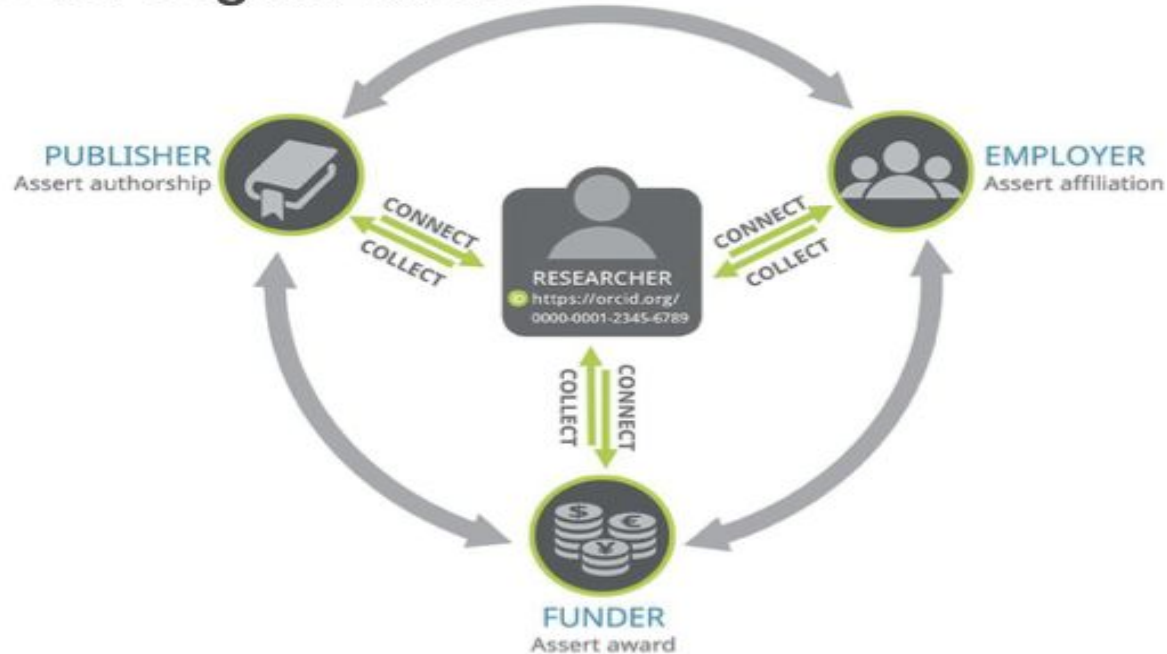

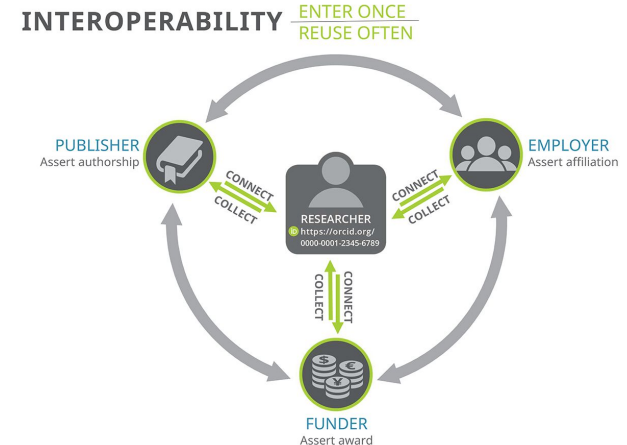
ORCID for Organizations



You have an **ORCID**, now what? ...

- Add it to your Rowan Digital Works Researcher Profile (Only available to faculty) email rdw@rowan.edu for more information OR Or to your PIVOT Profile
- Add it to your grant applications.
- Add it to your affiliation information when submitting manuscripts to journals.
- Add it to your email signature.
- Add it to other research profiles such as Scopus ID, ResearcherID, or your SciENcv.
- Add it to your CV and/or tenure applications.

Adding your ORCID to other researcher profiles generates increased promotion and access to your scholarly activity.

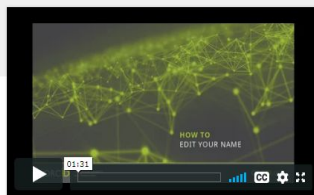

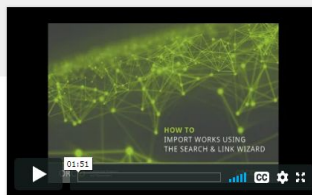

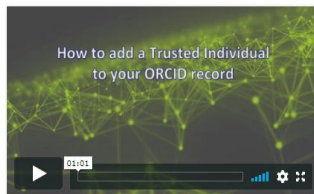
