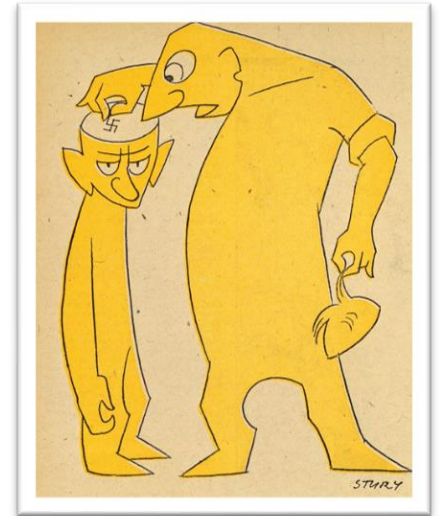

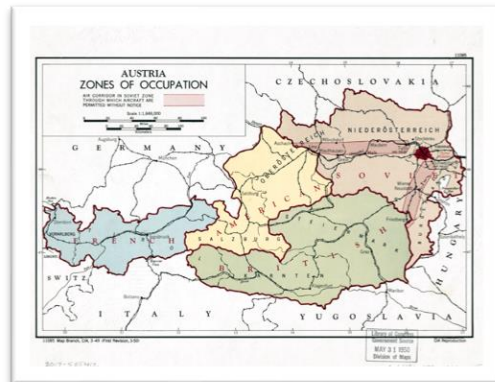

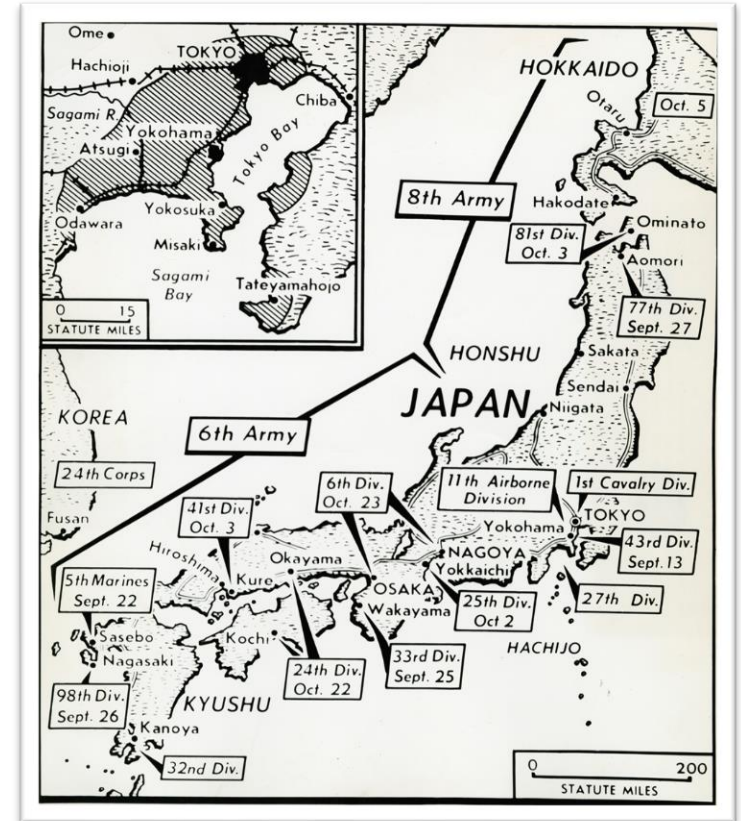
Italy, 1943-1945
