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# Poster: Do our graduate students know the library's books are online now?

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#### Motivation for the study

I encountered a graduate student in my library looking for a book on the shelf and explained that it was probably available through the library online as an e-book.

I decided to survey our graduate students to see if they were aware that most of our books are available as e-books, not in print.

#### Methodology

- Created an IRB approved online survey in Qualtrics with 13 questions.
- 2. Solicited responses for 2 months in fall 2023 from members of the university's graduate student listserv.
- 3. Received 113 responses; analyzed by population.

#### Results

- Most (71%) of graduate students were aware of library e-books.
- Doctoral students had a high level of awareness of e-books (80%), while master's students had less (64%).
- Usage of e-books was lower than awareness, especially between master's (52%) and doctoral students (78%).

Of note: Graduate students who had used library e-books praised their availability at point of need from the library website - versus having to visit in person to check out a physical book. But surprisingly, our 100% online students had the least awareness of e-books!

#### Reasons for using e-books

 By far the most common reason was because it was recommended by their instructor for a course

Required textbook	39
Required textbook, Non- academic book	24
I have never used an e-book	21
Other	15
Non-academic book	10
Required textbook, Other	3
Required textbook, Non- academic book, Other	1

## **Additional findings**

- More than half of respondents use e-books more often now since the COVID-19 pandemic
- Most students read e-books on laptop computers, very few on tablets or phones
